



KONE's disclosure according to Sustainability Accounting Standards Board (SASB) standards

KONE's climate disclosures are aligned with the CSRD and ESRS requirements. While the SASB standards have been incorporated into the ISSB's IFRS Sustainability Disclosure Standards, KONE has mapped its sustainability disclosures against the SASB standards to support consistency, transparency and comparability of industry-specific, financially material information. The table below cross-references the location of SASB-aligned disclosures within KONE's published reports.

However, KONE incorporates its provisions to the disclosure requirements for suppliers. Consequently, while KONE does not track substances according to the reporting rules in the IEC standard, it has implemented a requirement to targeted suppliers to disclose all substances present in a concentration of 0.1% or more in their products.		
	Percentage of eligible products, by revenue, that meet ENERGY STAR® criteria	Elevators and escalators are not eligible for the ENERGY STAR® certification. KONE describes the progress on its products' energy efficiency in its latest Sustainability Statement 2025, p 55-60.		
	Revenue from renewable energy-related and energy efficiency-related products	By the end of 2025, KONE had 27 highest A-class ratings for elevator models, and 12 highest A+++ classifications for escalators and autowalk models, according to the ISO 25745 energy-efficiency standard. The ratings are based on third-party measurements conducted at customer sites and demonstrate KONE's ability to deliver best-in-class energy-efficient solutions. Measurements are based on most widely sold New Building Solutions. Actual energy performance may vary by project, as it depends on customer-specific specifications such as speed, load, usage patterns, and travel height.
